- Reviewing the entire site against WCAG 2.1 AA standards.
- Adding tools to allow users to adjust text size, colour schemes, and contrast.
- Improving navigation to ensure compatibility with screen readers and keyboard-only users.
- Ensuring all content is clearly structured using appropriate headings and labels.
